MAIL IN SHOPPING METHOD: by Dec 15 th

1. Open the tab called NEA-AGF 2016 and add the number of gifts in the highlighted column. It will calculate for you!
2. Print out the sheet. If near the NEA building (1201 16th Street) drop it off to Jim Groves in Suite 210 (HR). You can also give to guard at desk.

- If mailing in, follow these instructions:

- Put the completed shopping list in an envelope and....

- Include a check made out to AGGW and....

- include a SASE (self-addressed stamped envelope) - use a 4.5x6 or larger envelope if you don't want your gift inserts folded.

ELECTRONIC/PAYPAL METHOD: by Dec 15 th !

E1: Follow steps 1 and 2 above, either on paper or on a device.

E2: Use Paypal.com to "send money" to AGGW_inc@yahoo.com for the total amount.

E3: IMPORTANT: send an email to jgroves4ward2@gmail.com, with your list of gifts "ordered" (how many of which items), and your phone number and address. We can then verify your payment and send you your gift cards!

These steps should be completed by Dec 15 if you want inserts mailed back to you before the holidays.

That's it! We will send back the inserts describing the gift and organizations for every gift you purchase (unless noted that you don't need them or don't need all of them) along with your receipt to keep for tax purposes. Thanks and Have a Great Holiday!

AGGW was founded on the premise that sometimes the most thoughtful gift you can give someone is a donation to charity in their honor. Alternative gifts fill direct and tangible needs at home and abroad, such as books for children in transitional housing or a water filter for a family in Haiti. Family members and friends are touched to know that the gift they have just received will have a very real and meaningful impact on people and communities in need. Beneficiary organizations who offer their gifts at the annual holiday fairs address some of the most pressing problems in our world today. They are working to eradicate poverty and hunger, provide disaster relief, shelter the homeless, give children access to education, attend to medical needs and protect our environment.

Inspired by the work of Alternative Gifts International, AGGW sponsors alternative gift fairs in the Washington, DC area. AGGW also works to spread the word about opportunities to visit the many gift fairs and markets in the DC region. At an alternative gift fair, a shopper finds causes to match the interests and passions of everyone on their holiday shopping list. AGGW grew out of the Takoma Park Alternative Gift Fair, which started in 1999 and has been held annually since then. In 2004, the project evolved into an incorporated, nonprofit organization governed by a board of directors. AGGW has helped several smaller fairs to organize in the area and served as their fiscal agent.
